



The Estate Grown Difference

100% Estate Grown and Estate Bottled

Strict standards must be met for a wine bottle to be marked as “Estate Grown” or “Estate Bottled”. To achieve such a distinction, the United States federal government requires:

1. 100% of the wine must be made from grapes grown on land owned or controlled by the winery.
2. The vineyards must be in an American Viticultural Area, or AVA, which are specially designated areas recognized by the government for their unique wine-growing features.
3. All vineyards and the winery itself must be located within the same AVA.
4. After harvest and all the way through bottling (or canning), the wine must not leave the winery.

“From the Colorado Land”

The name COLTERRIS means “from the Colorado land.” 100% of Colterris and “Canterris” wines are Estate Grown and Estate Bottled in the Grand Valley AVA of Palisade, Colorado.

Situated on the Colorado River, the favorable meso-climates and volcanic soils of our vineyard locations contribute to the rich color, intense fruit flavors, and robust character that make Colterris wines unique. Our commitment to the Estate Grown standard allows our winemakers to guide the vinification process from harvest all the way to the glass, cultivating the very best aspects of Colterris wines from our vineyards.
